Dear Parents and Guardians,

I am excited to share that on March 1, 2019, our school has been invited to participate in the National Winter Activity Center's (NWAC) cross-country skiing program. The NWAC is an organization committed to "improving the lives of youth through winter activity." Please see the attached fliers for more information about the NWAC.

To prepare for our trip, the NWAC staff will visit Walnut Ridge on February 25 to fit each student with boots and cross-country skis. Please provide your child's shoe size and return to school by February 1, 2019. All boots and skis for this event will be provided free of charge from the NWAC.

The schedule of the day will be as follows:

- Arrive to the NWAC located at 44 Breakneck Road, Vernon, New Jersey
- Meet NWAC staff and change into ski boots and skis
- Participate in the ski program for approximately 1 hour
- Snack time provided by the NWAC
- Return back to Walnut Ridge

Important things to know about the day:

- Please dress your child in snow gear (snow pants, jacket, hat, mittens). If you do not have appropriate snow pants, jacket, etc. please let us know and we will make sure there are some extras available for you.
- We will be skiing on *flat surfaces only and will stay at the bottom of the mountain!* Think of it as "walking" but on small skis!
- The NWAC will be prepared with additional staff on our visit
- The students will be divided into small groups of 5-8 students
- Additional staff from Walnut Ridge will attend the trip

If you have any questions about the trip, you are invited to attend an information session on February 6th at 12:15 pm in The Walnut Ridge School's gym. A staff member from the NWAC will be present to answer any of your questions.
